
## The single biggest cause of homelessness in England is the ending of a tenancy in the private rented sector



## The story behind the numbers

When a homeless household turns to their local council for help, the main reason for their homelessness is recorded.

For the past year, the ending of an assured shorthold tenancy (the main type of tenancy used in the private rented sector) has been the biggest single cause of homelessness. This has increased steadily, from 15% in 2011 to 29% today. In London it is even higher, with nearly 4 in 10 (39%) households stating loss of a shorthold tenancy as the primary reason they have approached the council for help.

More than **4 million** people live in the private rented sector today, more than double the number in 2002. At the same time, private landlords offer some of the worst housing conditions, with **30**% of properties failing to meet the Decent Homes Standard and **37**% of private rented sector tenants living in poverty.
